

## FOR YOUR AND OUR SAFETY

In the following rules you will find the most important house rules that apply within Hotel Maassluis. We ask that you respect and accept these rules.

#### General rules

- All instructions from staff at this hotel that are related to house rules must be followed. You can report complaints / comments to the management.
- Keep calm in the event of a fire. Report a fire at reception and / or hit the nearest fire alarm.
- Leave the building immediately with a general fire alarm.
- Never use the lifts in the event of a fire.
- A valid ID must be presented at check-in. You can check in from the age of 18.
- Cameras are hanging in various places within the hotel. In the event of an emergency and / or incident, these recordings can be handed over to the authorities as supporting material.
- You must hand in lost items at reception.
- Hotel Maassluis is not responsible for any loss or theft to any personal belongings.
- The management, the owner of this location and / or persons working for the hotel cannot be held liable for any injury and / or material or non-material damage that visitors to the location might experience.

## In addition, it is prohibited to:

- Use emergency exits as normal entrances and exits.
- Take property from the hotel outside of the building. In the case of wilful damage to property of Hotel Maassluis, one can be held liable for the repair and / or renewal costs.
- Consume, use, trade or take narcotic drugs.
- Use laughing gas in the hotel without the express permission of the management.
- To cause an inconvenience to someone else, for example through loud music, unacceptable behaviour or noise of any kind.
- To stay in the room with more than the permitted number of people.
- Receive paying guests in the room for sexual activities.
- Smoke in the room. If we find out that someone smoked in the room, we are forced to charge a cleaning fee of €175,-. If the fire alarm is triggered by smoke in the room, the call-out costs of the fire department will be charged to you.

\*In all cases not covered by these regulations, the management of Hotel Maassluis decides.





#### **ALARM**

In case of emergency, we request that you contact the reception immediately. You can do this by dialing number 9 on the telephone in the room, this will connect you directly to reception.



## **BABYBED / EXTRA BED**

For an additional charge (and subject to availability), you can have a baby cot or extra bed placed in your room via our reception.



## LUGGAGE

By means of a trolley you can easily transport your luggage to your room. The trolley can be borrowed based on availability. You can contact reception for this.



## BAR

The opening hours of our bar vary daily. Our bar is climate controlled. You will find the bar on the ground floor.

Pets are allowed in all public areas and in some rooms. Contact reception for more information.



#### INTERNET

Free wireless internet is available throughout the building. The network name is 'KPN'. You do not need a password for this. When you connect to the KPN network, a pop-up will appear in which you must accept the terms and conditions. After you have accepted the terms and conditions, you can make unlimited use of our free wireless network.



## **DISABLED TOILET**

The hotel has a disabled toilet next to reception.



## **ROOM KEY**

Please leave your key card at reception when checking out.



## **COMPLAINTS/COMMENTS**

Any complaints or comments can be reported to the reception. They will pass them on to the manager on duty.



## **CLIMATE CONTROL**

All rooms in the hotel have climate control. You can also enjoy climate control in the public areas, such as the bar, restaurant and conservatory.



## REFRIGERATOR

Each room has a small refrigerator, which you can use during your stay.





#### SAFE

There is a safe in each room where you can store your valuables. The management accepts no liability for loss or theft of valuables.

#### Instructions for use:

You close the safe by entering a personal 4 to 6 digit code and pressing '#'. When the safe is closed, enter the same code to open it. Please leave the safe door open when leaving.



## LUNCH PACKAGE/BREAKFAST PACKAGE

You can order a packed lunch or breakfast at reception the day before.



#### **MINIBAR**

See chapter "Refrigerator". The minibar contains the following items: one bottle of red wine, one bottle of white wine, one can of Heineken, one bottle of Smirnoff, one bottle of Bacardi, two bottles of water, one can of Cola, one bag of Maltesers and one can of Pringles.



## DO NOT DISTURB

If you do not wish to be disturbed during your stay in your hotel room, you can use the 'do not disturb' switch next to the door. A red light will come on outside. If you would like cleaning, you can use the 'cleaning' switch. This will cause a green light to come on.



## **EMERGENCY EXITS**

All emergency exits are clearly marked in the hallways and are equipped with emergency lighting. Also check the floor plan on the inside of your room door to see where the nearest emergency exit is located.



## **BREAKFAST**

The breakfast buffet in our restaurant is open Monday to Friday from 7:00 AM to 10:00 AM and Saturday to Sunday from 7:30 AM to 10:30 AM.



## **BREAKFAST ROOM SERVICE**

It is possible to have breakfast delivered to your room between 7:30 and 10:30. You pay a €12.50 room service surcharge for this. To order room service breakfast, please contact reception (at least the evening before). You can do this by dialing number 9 on the telephone in the room, which will connect you directly to reception.



#### **POST**

Incoming mail can be collected at reception.



#### PRICING

The prices charged for the rooms include VAT and exclude breakfast and municipal taxes.



#### RADIO

Hotel Maassluis is a non-smoking hotel. Smoking is allowed on your balcony and at the entrance of the hotel.

# **Explore the beach**

## Hoek van Holland

The beach is located less than 15 minutes from Hotel Maassluis. Do you like to go on a walk on the beach, go surfing or do you prefer to enjoy the sun at one of the beach clubs, Hoek van Holland has activities for everyone!



## Public transport

The beach is easy to reach by public transport. The metro stop 'Maassluis Centrum' is located less than ten minutes from Hotel Maassluis.

Metro line B towards Hoek van Holland departs here every twenty minutes. You will reach the Hoek van Holland Strand stop within thirteen minutes.



## **Parking**

The beach is also easy to reach by car. You can park free of charge in Hoek van Holland all year round. There is a large car park on 'Badweg', a five-minute walk from the beach.



## Dogs at the beach

In the dunes & on the southernmost part of the beach, dogs are welcome off-leash all year round. For the wide bathing part (in front of the beach clubs) apply the following rules: From the 1st of May to the 1st of October, dogs are not welcome on the beach directly in front of the beach clubs between 9:00 and 19:00 hr.

From the 1st of October to the 1st of May dogs are welcome on the entire beach off-leash.

## Scheveningen

## **Parking**

Scheveningen beach can easily be reached by car. Unfortunately, it takes quite a longtime to reach the beach by public transport from Hotel Maassluis.

We would recommend parking at one of the parking garages in Scheveningen. Street parking costs €50,- for the entire day. At the moment there are no hourly rates available, due to a trial of the municipality of The Hague. We are happy to share our parking tips with you!

- Interparking Boulevard: This garage is located near the Carlton Beach Hotel at Strandweg 179. Booking in advance can save parking costs.
- Parking garage Zwarte Pad Scheveningen. This car park is located on the north side of Scheveningen Boulevard and is open 24 hours a day.
- Parkeergarage Nieuwe Parklaan: This garage is located near the AFAS circus theatre & Holland Casino



## Dogs at the beach

From the 15th of May to the 1st of October, dogs are allowed all day on Strandslag 1, 2, 9 & 10. After 21:00 hr, dogs are welcome on the entire beach.

From the 1st of October to the 15th of May, dogs are welcome on the entire beach of Scheveningen. However, dogs must be kept on leash in the dunes.

## **Hotspots in Rotterdam**

Rotterdam has several must-see places that should not be missed when visiting the city. We have listed some of them for you.

#### Euromast

A visit to the Euromast should not be missed when you are in Rotterdam. When you take the elevator to the top of the Euromast, you will have a beautifull view over the whole city. The Euromast is 185 meters high and at 100 meters you will find a restaurant and a viewpoint. The top of the tower can be visited with an elevator.

## Erasmusbridge

From the city centre, you can easily walk towards the Erasmus Bridge. This is one of the icons from Rotterdam and is also known as 'the Swan'. From here, you can check out the famous skyline of Rotterdam.

#### Watertaxi

Want to experience Rotterdam spectacularly? Choose the water taxi! Not only will the water taxi bring you from point A to point B, they also offer canal cruises. During the cruise, the captain will show you the city and its historical & modern ports.

## Laurenskerk

During the second world war, almost the entire city was bombed. This church is one of the few buildings that were spared. Visiting the Laurenskerk is the perfect way to see the history of Rotterdam.

## SS Rotterdam

This used to be the Flagship of the Holland-America line. Nowadays the ship is permanently moored in the Maashaven in Rotterdam.

Part of the ship is freely accessible. Here you will find a restaurant with an on-deck terrace. The rest of the ship can only be visited by one of the organised guided tours.

## • Fire border Rotterdam

On the 14th of May, 1940, the German bombardment of Rotterdam took place. Within less than 15 minutes the entire inner city was destroyed. The city burned for days and the border of the devastated area was given its own nickname 'de Brandgrens'.

Today this border can be followed as a walking/biking route.

At 10 minutes' distance from Hotel Maassluis you find the metro stop 'Maassluis Centrum'. From here a metro leaves every 10 minutes in the direction of Rotterdam.

At the metro stop 'Schiedam Centrum', you will make a transfer to the train. You can best leave the train at The Hague central station.

## Hotspots in The Hague

The Hague is quite a diverse city and thus has something to offer for everyone! During your visit, you will find culture, history, politics & the Royal Family of the Netherlands. From the city centre, it is quite easy to visit Scheveningen Beach as well. In short, The Hague has something to offer for everyone! We have listed some must-see sights for your visit to The Hague.

#### Binnenhof & Ridderzaal

'Het Binnenhof' is the political heart of the Netherlands. Here all political & state decisions are made. The Ridderzaal is used every year by the king, to read out the political & state plans for the upcoming year.

Currently, renovation work is being carried out until 2026 and modified opening hours may apply.

## • Noordeinde Palace

This palace is the working palace of the Dutch sovereign. The palace is located right in the city centre. During the summer closing, it is possible to visit the palace for a limited amount of days. Tickets are available in June. The Palace Garden is accessible year-round and the exterior of the palace is definitely worth seeing too! The Palace Garden is open every day from sunrise to sunset.

#### Peace Palace

The Hague is the city of Peace & Law. For many centuries, The Hague has been the city for international peace agreements. Today the International Court of Justice & the International Criminal Court are located in the Peace Palace. Normally, the Peace Palace isn't open to the public. For a few weekends a year, the Peace Palace will open its doors to the public. You can reserve tickets for these days through the Peace Palace website. The visitor centre is open to the public from Tuesday to Sunday.

#### Grote Kerk

This church is also known as St. Jacob's Church. The church is one of the oldest buildings in the Netherlands. When visiting the tower of the church, you will have a beautiful view of the skyline of The Hague. The viewpoint is located at a height of 92,5 meters.

#### Prison Gate

This medieval prison is located right in the city centre of The Hague. The gate used to be the main gate to the Binnenhof, but over time it became a prison. Prisoners have been held here for over four centuries. Among these prisoners were some famous regents.

The Prison Gate is open from Tuesday to Sunday.

## Scheveningen

Within twenty minutes you can be on the beach of Scheveningen from the city centre of The Hague. Here you can take a walk along the coast, visit the pier or visit one of the restaurants on the boulevard.

You can also visit the Kurhaus. Nowadays, this is a hotel but it used to have several other functions.

## Shopping in Delft

Delft has a wide range of stores. From boutique stores or souvenirs to big chain stores, Delft has it all.

At the Zuidpoort & de Veste, you will mainly find the larger chains like H&M, the Sting, Jack & Jones etc.

Furthermore, you will find various stores along the canals and on the various squares.

## Museums in Delft

- Stedelijk Museum 'het Prinsenhof'; in 1584, Willem of Orange was assisinated here. The holes in the wall, created by the gunshot, are still visible. Also on display, is the exhibition 'Master of Innovation'. A collaboration between scientists and painters such as Rubens & van Heemskerck.
- Koninklijke Porceleyne Fles & Royal Delft; This factory dates back to the 17th century and is the last remaining factory still producing Delfts Blue by hand. You can also visit a museum on Delfts Blue.
- Science Centre Delft; This museum focuses on the research & discoveries which have been done by the students of the Technical University in Delft. You can also participate in several workshops in the science centre.
- Vermeer Centrum; Johannes Vermeer, one of the most famous painters of the 17th century, lived in Delft all his life. Therefore, this museum is dedicated to the painter. Please note that no original paintings by Vermeer are on display.

## **Hotspots in Delft**

Delft is a city with a rich history. You can find this all over the city centre.

We are happy to share the must-see sights with you!

## City Hall

On the market square, you will find the City Hall. The original City Hall dates back to the 11th century, however it was severely damaged during a fire. The City Hall in its current form dates back to 1640. Today, the City Hall still functions as the City Hall and is therefore not fully open to the public. During school vacations, 'het Steen' can be visited with a guided tour. This used to be a prison and several persons were tortured in this room.

#### Nieuwe Kerk

Facing the City Hall, you can find the 'Nieuwe Kerk'. This church is known as the final resting place of the Dutch Royal Family, as the royal tomb is located in the church. It is possible to visit the tower of the church. From there you will have a beautiful view of the city.

## Oostpoort Delft

In 1400, Delft was surrounded by a wall to defend the city from intruders. There used to be eight city gates, but the Oostpoort is the only remaining one.

You can easily visit the Oostpoort, as it is only a short walk from the city centre. At night the gate is extra lit up, making it even more beautiful.

#### Canal cruise

Discover the city centre from the water. During the canal cruise, you will pass by the beautiful sights of Delft.

## Botanical garden

Do you want to escape the busy city centre of Delft? Then discover the botanical garden of Delft. Apart from being a popular spot for tourists, it is also an important research place for scientists. Research has been done here for over a century.

The Botanical Garden is open Monday to Saturday from 10:00 - 17:00 hr.

## Klauterwoud

This is the ideal adventure playground for everyone who loves adventure, water & isn't scared of getting dirty. Children can play with natural equipments, pull themselves across the water on a raft or slide down a cable car. There is also plenty of space to rest and relax at one of the picnic tables. Furthermore, there are also toilets available. Klauterwoud is located in Vlaardingen and is easily accessible by car. Parking is possible at Watersportweg 11 or Watersportweg 21 in Vlaardingen. Klauterwoud is open from sunrise to sunset and the toilets are open on Wednesday afternoons and during weekends.

## • Indoor Amusement Park Maassluis

The Indoor Amusement Park in Maassluis is the perfect activity for a day with bad weather. Here you find trampolines, an indoor playground, a glow golf course & you can even play fun-bowling here! ## • CHILDREN'S FARM

The petting zoo in Maassluis, called Kinderboerderij De Dierenhoek, is a popular place for children and families to experience animals up close. Located in green surroundings, the petting zoo offers a chance to meet different farm animals, such as goats, sheep, chickens, rabbits and sometimes even some more exotic animals like alpacas.

Activities: Besides viewing and petting the animals, the petting zoo often organises educational activities, workshops, and seasonal events such as lambing days or craft afternoons. Children can also help feed the animals and learn about animal care.



## SWIMMING POOL THE DOLPHIN

Swimming pool De Dolfijn in Maassluis is a popular recreational destination for both children and adults. The pool features various facilities such as a large swimming area, a paddling pool, and slides for extra fun. Visitors can enjoy swimming lessons, aqua fitness and other water activities.
